Minor Ministerial Musings

I've been thinking a lot lately about children in the church. I've been thinking about children's ministries, and the relationship between the growth of children's ministries and the growth of the church. I've been thinking especially about the children in our church, at Hickory Hills, and the stories that I have heard about the children of the church in the years before I came to be your pastor.

I hear a lot of stories about how there used to be so many children in the church. I have seen pictures of a full-to-overflowing chancel, packed with children eager to see what was in the "Junk Box". I've seen pictures, too, of Lenten Series and Vacation Bible Schools from past years. Downstairs, I walk through the hall of children's classrooms and nursery, thinking of what I have heard about the number of children who used to swarm the hall, and how this year, we have only needed one teacher for the elementary ages. And the nursery has mostly stood empty, sometimes even used as temporary storage.

And then I look at the wall of Kid's Club pictures, including one of my office, filled with children – some wearing one or more of my stoles – with me in the back barely able to be seen by the camera because of all the children. Some weeks I am able to steal down to the fellowship hall to join the Kid's Club for a craft or a story. Other weeks, I just enjoy the noise of playing and learning and fellowship from my office overlooking the gym.

And then I look around at our marvelous group of youth and young adults. I see their initiative, their love of God and of each other, their devotion to worship – some at the morning services, some at the evening praise service. I see their maturity and leadership. And I realize that these are the kids that grew up in Kid's Club, Sunday School, Lenten Series, and Vacation Bible School. They are the ones in the pictures I have seen, now well on their way to adulthood, too grown for the little chairs in the classrooms downstairs. Some are graduating from high school this year – some will stay close by, and some will move farther down the road.

It is then that I begin to get a slightly different perspective on children's ministries. You see, I'm not sure that anyone in the church ever outgrows the need to be fed by children's ministries. Not if children are defined, not in terms of age or grade alone, but in terms of being children of God. We are all children of God, and growing in our life of faith is a lifelong journey. The first chapter of John's gospel reminds us that "to all who received him, who believed in his name, we gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God." And John 3:1 urges us to "see what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are." Whatever age we are, we are children of God through God's love for us.

What does this say about children's ministries in the church? Keep doing them, of course! Keep proclaiming our love for children, our desire to help them live and grow in the faith, and our commitment to offering a safe place to learn and play and know the love of God and of Hickory Hills Presbyterian Church.

And if there are times when we begin to compare the full halls and classrooms and chancels of years ago with the size of our existing Sunday Schools and chancels, simply remember that we are here to minister to the children of God of all ages. Look around at our wonderful youth, and adults from young to young-at-heart, and remember that we are all still children – children of God, called to learn and to serve. Called to seek God’s word, to share and celebrate God’s love, and to serve Jesus Christ in the world. In practical terms of children’s ministries and adult ministries, they are mutually dependent – you cannot have one without the other. They are all “children of God” ministries, providing nurture and learning and growth for every stage of life and faith. They are all a part of God’s call on each of our lives, our calling as children of God.

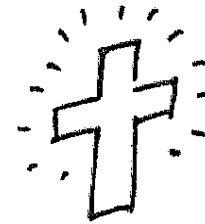

I never cease to be amazed by what our Lord does. And when He uses people to give us examples of His creative genius, what discoveries!

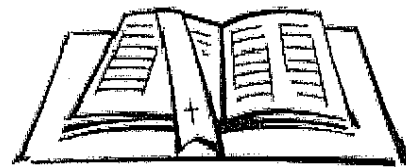

"...A Rare and Creative Musical Intelligence..."

Composer, conductor and teacher Alice Parker was born in Boston, Massachusetts, on December 16, 1925. She began composing early in life, and wrote her first orchestral score while still in high school. She graduated from Smith College with a major in music performance and composition, then receiving her master's degree from the Juilliard School where she studied choral conducting with Robert Shaw.

Her life work has been in choral and vocal music, combining composing, conducting and teaching in a creative balance. Her arrangements with Robert Shaw of folksongs, hymns and spirituals form an enduring repertoire for choruses all around the world. She continues composing in many forms,



from operas to cantatas, sacred anthems to secular dances, song cycles to string quartets. She has been commissioned by such groups as the Vancouver Chamber Chorus, the Atlanta Symphony Chorus and Chanticleer. Her many conducting and teaching engagements keep her traveling around the United States and Canada.

In 1985, she founded Melodious Accord, Inc., a non-profit group which presents choral concerts, sponsors workshops, symposia, and her many professional appearances. The Fellows programs have provided unique training for composers, conductors and song leaders. Her techniques have encouraged a generation of music teachers and choral conductors to think about music and the act of conducting in new ways. No less an authority than Robert Shaw himself has said of Parker that "...she possesses a rare and creative musical intelligence."

She has made thirteen acclaimed recordings, most with the Musicians of Melodious Accord, a sixteen-voice professional chorus. Recent releases include *My Love and I; Listen, Lord; O Sing the Glories; The Family Reunion; Angels and Challengers*, and the remastered-for-CD *Songs for Eve*. The organization has received support from the National Endowment for the Arts, the Copland Foundation, and the New York State Council for the Arts.

Now a resident of western Massachusetts, Parker has published books on melodic styles, choral improvisation and 'Good Singing in Church'. Her detailed analysis, *The Anatomy of Melody*, was released in 2006. Five videos have appeared, showing her work with hymns and folksongs. She has been recognized by Chorus America, the American Guild of Organists, the American Choral Directors Association, The Hymn Society and Choral Arts New England for her lifetime contributions to choral music. She is the recipient of five honorary doctorates and the Smith College Medal.

Alice Parker has said of her artistic vision: *"I believe that melody is the foundation of human music-making, and that song issuing from one human throat is the essential first-step to a musical life. I am fascinated with the combination of words and music, thus I have concentrated on choral and vocal works, using the very best texts that I can find. Chamber music involving small groups of voices and instruments is a favorite medium.*

I am a devotee of folk songs from many cultures, as well as the rediscovery of Christian hymns from many centuries. Melodies which last teach me about the nature of melody itself, and I never tire of composing, arranging, conducting and teaching from these ever-flowing sources."

Winner of the "Snickers Balance" for the month of March was Penny. Did she really balance 11 candy bars? Good work and congratulation on this accomplishment!


