Minor Ministerial Musings

BINLI!

I want to talk about BINLI. It is very common to run into BINLI in churches, though it can be found in other organizations which depend heavily on volunteers. It is especially common in churches which are growing, trying to grow, headed in new directions, or simply trying new things. BINLI flourishes in situations where there are overworked, over-tired, or overcommitted leaders – but it also thrives on uncertain leadership and underutilized talent. BINLI can be particularly sneaky, because it usually follows closely on the heels of creative leadership and promising new ideas, almost like it is looking for something positive to latch on to, so it can sneak into the life of the church.

Getting curious? Confused? Let me give an example. Someone in the congregation has an idea for a new ministry – a mission project, a fellowship event, a special worship service. It can be a one-time event, a long-term project, or an ongoing ministry. He or she brings the idea to the appropriate committee, or to Session, or the pastor. Things seem to be going well, and then – BINLI!

“But I’m Not Leading It!”

Sound familiar? Have you heard this before, or even said it yourself? “We should start a men’s group – But I’m Not Leading It.” “We should have a special service to honor an important time in the life of the congregation – But I’m Not Leading It.” “I see a real need for a new or larger committee to take better care of certain ministries or people in the church. But I’m Not Leading It.”

You get the picture. Great ideas and inspirations are so vital in a church, a body of followers of Christ who are seeking to love God and others, to grow in their own faith, and to share Christ’s love and salvation with the world. New ideas for ministry are the way we are able to keep alive our mission statement, finding new ways to SEEK God’s Word, SHARE and CELEBRATE God’s Love, and SERVE Jesus Christ in the World. But all too often, BINLI sneaks in right on the heels of inspiration, and new ideas are stopped in their tracks. Without the leadership or manpower to research, launch, and support a new idea for ministry, it falls flat. BINLI can be insidious.

Here’s the really tricky part, though. BINLI, at its source, is justified. Your idea may come from something new you want to learn, and thus you don’t want to or can’t teach it yourself. You may be full of new ideas, but your calendar of commitments may be even more full, with less than no room for any new undertakings. You may have great ideas, but simply not know how to implement them and not feel confident or qualified to be in a leadership role.

The key, then, is to not let BINLI stop ministry ideas in their tracks. If you have a new idea, or there is a ministry you would like to see start or grow at the church, come to Session. Come to the pastor. Come to the committee where the idea seems to fit best. And then ask for help. Join with others in brainstorming what and who would be needed for this new ministry to really take off, and think outside the box in seeking out the talents and gifts in the congregation that would best strengthen and support it. Don’t step out into new territory by yourself – especially if you are already overworked or overcommitted, or if you don’t feel equipped for the leadership that is needed. But don’t let BINLI stop you, either. We are a congregation – a family – and we need each other to grow in our faith and our ministries. See you Sunday! In Joyful Anticipation, *Pastor Lara*
